Challenges in the Western Balkans



Hamper the identification and implementation of much needed investments

Socio-economic infrastructure



Socio-economic challenges include vulnerable groups e.g. youth unemployment, brain drain and economic informality.

Technical expertise



Lack of technical, management and financial expertise across public and private sector. Procurement issues and subsequent TA needs.

Climate challenges



Energy mix still overly carbon intensive and reliant on fossil fuels. Limited awareness and little incentives for greening the business model.



Opportunity: The New Growth Plan for the Western Balkans

- ❖ The New Growth Plan for the Western Balkans was adopted by the EC on the 8th of November 2023
- It aims to accelerate socio-economic convergence and it comprises of 4 Pillars:
- Pillar 1: Access to the EU Single Market
- Pillar 2: Boosting Economic Integration within the Western Balkans (Common Regional Market)
- Pillar 3: Accelerating Fundamental Reforms to unlock economic growth potential
- Pillar 4: Increased Financial Assistance for 2024-2027 (€6bn Reform and Growth Facility)





Impact of EIB on-lending on SMEs' access to finance in the Western Balkans EIB Economics Study, 2023

- > The EIB plays a central role in the financing of SMEs and mid-caps in the WBs
 - EIB channels liquidity through financial intermediaries on favourable conditions (lower interest rates or longer tenor)
- > EIB's intermediated lending has a positive impact on employment in the WBs
 - SMEs benefiting from EIB loans reported a 15% increase in employment growth
- > EIB intermediated lending has a positive impact on firm investment in the WBs
 - Firms with EIB loans experienced a 20% rise in total assets
