

Recruitment Timeframes

August to January

Graduate schemes open - some fixed date, some rolling

Formal internship schemes open including parliamentary internships

October to April

Assessments & offers
Traineeship applications

June to September

Internships, grad schemes begin

Smaller organisations in public and private sector hire throughout the year

Off-cycle schemes and ad hoc roles



Graduate Schemes:

Used by organisations recruiting a high number of graduates.
Often these offer group training and 'rotation' programmes.

Graduate Jobs:

Used by small and large orgs to recruit into a permanent role. graduates are trained by the team and their manager.
