PLP event with Dr Federica Fragapane on 'Data visualisation: alive visual words'



We are very excited to announce an exciting Public Lecture Programme (PLP) event that we are hosting on 20 November with <u>Dr Federica Fragapane</u>. Federica is an independent information designer. Over the years, she has designed data visualisations for Google, UN, the Publications Office of the EU, BBC Science Focus, Atmos. Federica will be virtually joining this discussion about data visualisation and Dr Marta Foresti and Dr Francesca Panero will be in person at the event to be her discussants, alongside our very own Professor Irini Moustaki who will chair the event. There will be a talk between all three discussants and then a short Q&A segment. After that, there will be a drinks and nibbles reception until 9pm. All of those who attend the talk are welcome to the reception.

The talk will explore the design process and motivations behind data visualization projects, characterized by different usage contexts, responding to various needs, and with differing levels of experimentation. It will focus on the visual languages used to shape information and stories and delve into how visual words in data visualizations can be alive and sometimes political.

Designing data visualizations will be likened to writing, reflecting on the usage of visual alphabets to convey information. As in writing, the choice of words is essential, this principle will be applied to the language of data visualization, exploring the process behind decisions

to use organic visual languages to reflect the living presence behind the data and, in some cases, the fragility of the data itself.

The talk will explore how different visual words have been used to visualize information and stories covering various topics such as migration, the climate crisis and its solutions, and inequalities. The aesthetics of such representations will be discussed as an important element: an invitation to readers to spend time on the data and the stories, with the hope of achieving the main goal: communication.



Thursday 29 February 2024, (6pm - 8pm) Worshipful Company of Actuaries prize giving and talk

This WCA event included a talk titled "The decline in natural capital and why it matters". The talk was delivered by external guest speakers Ian Trim.

Ian is currently undertaking a PhD at Anglia Ruskin University's Global Sustainability Institute. He has 20 years' experience in developing and delivering low carbon and sustainability programs in both the public and private sector. Prior to Guidehouse, where he works part time now, Ian spent a decade in the UK Government including acting as the UK's lead negotiator on carbon markets at the Paris COP, and leading the development of domestic policy focused on industrial and household energy efficiency. From 2011 to 2014, Ian worked for the UK's Foreign and Commonwealth Office in Moscow as the UK's lead in Russia on climate and environment issues."

The talk was followed by a catered networking opportunity between LSE Undergraduate Statistics students, WCA members and IFOA representatives.

The event included a prize giving ceremony for the WCA Prize which is not a school prize and awarded by the WCA and is given to Undergraduate students from their penultimate year, awarded for outstanding / excellent achievement.

Adam graduated from the LSE in 2007 with a BSc in Business Mathematics and Statistics.
