Great! There is still information below you should read.

### Offer Conditions/Outstanding documents

Please note that if your offer is conditional when you attend oncampus enrolment, you will be unable to enrol that day due to updates that must be made to our records. You should try to ensure that your offer is unconditional and that you have preenrolled before attending enrolment.

Admissions staff at enrolment will view your documents, and mark your conditions as met if your evidence is satisfactory, however, you must then wait for the system to update (usually overnight). You must then complete your pre-enrolment before you enrol in-person. If you are on a programme with any differing arrangements, you will have been informed this by your programme manager.
